Jump for a JUST WORLD!

The Jump for a Just World initiative had an extremely successful second year, kicked off in January by the second annual training show and gala dinner held at Belle Herbe Farm in Wellington, Florida. The event raised \$100,000 and brought JWJ to the attention of many equestrians interested in contributing to JWJ's efforts in aiding impoverished children in the developing world.

Over the course of the year, the number of Rider Ambassadors grew to include 28 professionals and 19 juniors/amateurs from 13 countries. Several Ambassadors visited the projects in Honduras, seeing firsthand the benefits that JWJ's programs bring to abandoned and at-risk children. Junior rider Natalie Johnson continued her outstanding support of JWJ, returning to Honduras and by the end of the year donating \$38,000 in prize money, the highest amount among the Rider Ambassadors. Junior riders in the United States, France, and Italy initiated

JWJ community service activities at their high schools, raising funds and awareness among their peers.

More than 15 prestigious horse shows in the United States, Europe, and Canada showcased JWJ, raising awareness in the international equestrian community of the need for humanitarian projects such as those funded by JWJ and supporting JWJ financially through sponsored classes, sales of JustWorld merchandise, parking fees, membership contributions, and donations by exhibitors and spectators. JWJ's efforts caught the attention of the organizers of the Global Champions Tour (GCT), which includes the prestigious horse shows in Palm Beach (USA), Cannes (France), Monte Carlo (Monaco), Aach (Germany), Valkenswaard (Holland), and Estoril (Portugal). For 2006, JustWorld International has been named the GCT's "Charity of Choice", so each show will include special fundraising events and classes for the benefit of JWJ.



Student Volunteers

In 2005, JustWorld continued to train and send university volunteers to work at its projects. More than thirty-five local and international university students contributed to JWJ's programs that provided services for vulnerable children throughout the year. Furthermore, during 2005, a number of young equestrians in high school and college contributed to JustWorld's actions by volunteering at JWJ projects and initiating awareness campaigns in their schools. JustWorld will continue to involve student volunteers in its projects in 2006.

JustWorld International PROJECT SITES

Honduras

In association with the government-run IHNFA center, which houses abandoned children, and the local NGO Compartir, which has programs for underprivileged children who have little or no access to education, JustWorld International successfully carried out its 2005 operations in Honduras. JustWorld established one of its former international student volunteers as on-site project coordinator to develop its projects in Honduras during 2005. JustWorld also recruited and trained more than 30 local Honduran student volunteers to create and implement projects helping underprivileged children. International student



volunteers also initiated and implemented dynamic projects at the two centers. Children benefited from JWI-funded activities including classical Honduran painting, piñata making, educational lectures, arts and crafts, sports, an early education program, a mobile library, music appreciation, and youth leadership seminars. While JWI continues to support volunteer activities and programs for the benefit of the children at these centers, its 2005 research and reconnaissance identified an additional partner for 2006. La Esperanza, a Garifuna organization from Tornabe, a village on the north coast of Honduras, has been working with limited resources to feed and educate the many orphaned children in its community. La Esperanza approached JWI and the foundations of a partnership were laid for 2006, at which time La Esperanza will be able to provide lunch daily, after-school tutoring, and other valuable extra-curricular activities through JWI support.



Cambodia

In 2005, JustWorld International continued to support the Stung Mean Chey school at the Phnom Penh municipal garbage dump. Children whose families live and work in the dump have access to education thanks to this school which is managed by JustWorld's partner, the People Improvement Organization. When the school moved to new



Kenya

JustWorld began exploring possibilities for working in Kenya during the summer of 2004 by sending a student



volunteer to survey the socio-economic situation as well as the different humanitarian organizations present in the country. JustWorld began working with one of those organizations, the Kibagare Compassion Group, during the summer of 2005. The Kibagare Compassion Group was formed in 1998 by a group of women from the Kibagare slums in Nairobi who were determined to help themselves and their community rise out of poverty. Unfortunately, the

nursery school they founded to educate the children of the community had to be closed in early 2005 due to lack of funding. JustWorld helped the Kibagare Compassion Group reopen the school and provided the funding to renovate the school and provide salaries for the teachers and administration. From a one-classroom, dirt-floor building with dilapidated tin walls, the school was transformed into three furnished classrooms with cement floors and restrooms. Classes can now be held according to age and education level with qualified teachers. An on-site JWI project coordinator continues to support the group in establishing a school that is not only self-sustainable but that can offer valuable community outreach programs. In 2006, JustWorld is planning on beginning a feeding program for the children and will consider expanding the school as necessary to meet the community's growing needs.



premises in May 2005, JWI organized the installation of a fresh water supply for the children to use for hygienic purposes.



As JustWorld continues to work in Cambodia in 2006, JustWorld plans to begin a feeding program, explore possibilities for purifying water to drink, and consider purchasing the school building.
